

Pentagon Has Plan To Close U.S. Military **Commissaries**



The Pentagon is floating a controversial plan to close all U.S.-based commissaries in 2015 as part of a

The commissaries are grocery stores that offer food and other necessities at a discount to members of the military, their families and veterans. But as Congress tightens the purse strings, the stores could get caught in the budget battle. Budget cutters say they don't yet know how much money the plan would save, but there are 178 commissaries in the United States and 70 overseas - which receive a total of \$1.4 billion in government funds.

Other military services - including the Pentagon Channel and the Stars and Stripes newspaper - may also face cuts, along with Armed Forces Radio and Television, which broadcasts football games and news for service members overseas. Stars and Stripes, an independently-edited military newspaper, has been around since the Civil War and has over 200,000 daily readers. It collects just \$7.8 million a year in government subsidies. To put this number in perspective, the U.S. spent \$135 million in fuel for the Afghan military this year - part of the \$4 billion the Norfolk, Va., for a two-week underway in order to nation budgeted to support the entire Afghan military complete Composite Training Unit Exercise this year.

Linked To Birth Defects



Water pollution at the Camp Lejeune military base, in North Carolina, has been linked to increased risk of birth defects and childhood cancers, according to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

A study released by the CDC's Agency for Toxic Substance & Disease Registry has confirmed a longsuspected link between chemical contaminants in tap water at the Marine Corps base and serious birth defects such as spina bifida. It also showed a slightly elevated risk of childhood cancers including leukemia.

Dr. Vikas Kapil, a medical officer and acting deputy director of the CDC agency that produced the study, said it surveyed the parents of 12,598 children born at Camp Lejeune between 1968 and 1985, the year most contaminated drinking water wells there were closed.

massive cost-saving effort after more than a decade of Bataan ARG Begins Composite Training **Unit Exercise**



Sailors from the multipurpose amphibious assault ship USS Bataan (LHD 5) and Marines from 22nd Marine Expeditionary Unit (MEU) departed Naval Station (COMPTUEX) off the East Coast of the United States.

This affords the *Bataan* Amphibious Ready Group the ability to interact with other ships including the George H.W. Bush Carrier Strike Group and smaller ships like the guided-missile destroyers USS Arleigh Burke (DDG 51), USS Truxtun (DDG 103) and the guided-missile cruiser USS Leyte Gulf (CG 55), among others.

During the exercise each ship will be assessed on command and control techniques, situational response, and a series of scenario-driven exercises including antisubmarine warfare, electronic warfare and maritime interdiction operations aimed at integrating the ships with the rest of the strike group.

"These exercises are extremely important for our sailors and the ship while preparing for deployment; we need to knock this out of the park," said Bataan Command Master Chief Kevin M. Goodrich. "The evolutions we will see during the exercise are the same scenarios currently deployed ships are seeing in their normal operations."

This exercise is scheduled as the last underway for Bataan's Amphibious Ready Group prior to her deployment and the last opportunity for the ships in her group to interact in a training environment prior to be tested by actual foreign interactions throughout the

Not A Very Bright Idea

The creator of a popular flashlight app for Android phones hid the fact that the app also shared the precise locations of its users to advertisers, the U.S. Federal Trade Commission (FTC) said.

Brightest Flashlight Free, which has been downloaded more than 50 million times, agreed to a settlement after the FTC found that it had shared its users' geo-location data and the unique identifiers assigned to devices without disclosing the practice to consumers.

The privacy policy for the app, which uses a phone's camera flash as a flashlight, said only that Brightest Flashlight Free collected information internally. Goldenshores Technologies, which created the app, also deceived consumers with a fake option of turning off the app's location-sharing service, the federal agency said.

Utah Man Allegedly Lied About War Injuries To Collect Benefits

A federal indictment alleges a West Valley City, Uta, man who worked as a congressional staffer through the Wounded Warrior Project lied about being injured during deployments in Iraq as an Army reservist in order to receive disability payments.

Gilbert Prado, 49, spent 17 years as a mechanic for the U.S. Army Reserve before his first deployment to Iraq in 2005 with the 146th Transportation Company, and worked as a congressional aide in 2010-2011 for Rep. Jason Chaffetz (R-Utah), according to records available online. A spokesperson for Chaffetz confirmed that the office asked for a federal investigation into Prado's background after becoming concerned about his claims.

A 15-count federal indictment issued accuses Prado of wire fraud and making false statements on disability claims filed with the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). The indictment filed in U.S. District Court says Prado falsely claimed he suffered a concussion, broken ribs and injuries to his hands and elbows in 2006 during a stint in Iraq when an improvised explosive device went off and tossed him into the side of a truck. He also allegedly claimed his elbows were injured breaking down doors while doing house-to-house searches in Iraq and that he suffered post-traumatic stress disorder after fatally shooting two men during a convoy mission. But prosecutors say Prado was never exposed to an improvised explosive device blast, never engaged in combat activity during a convoy mission and never participated in door-to-door searches while in Iraq.

In March 2009, Prado allegedly submitted a disability claim for traumatic brain injury and posttraumatic stress disorder (PTSD). The department denied the brain injury claim, but determined Prado was eligible for a disability rating of 10 percent based on PTSD. Over the next two years, Prado allegedly submitted more claims for injuries to his brain, elbows and hands and then filed appeals when the claims were denied. In March 2011, he allegedly sought an increased disability rating based on PTSD and the department raised his rating from 10 percent to 70 percent, resulting in an increase in his disability pay-ments. In all, the indictment alleges Prado received about \$18,000 in unwarranted disability payments between August 2011 and March 2012.

Last year, Chaffez urged the Pentagon to create an online database of veterans. He said he had been misled by two people - including Prado - who misrepresented their military service. The Utah congressman's proposal received support from the VFW, who said such a database would help streamline access to health care, disability benefits and other services. But military officials said such a database was not needed.

The Facts On The Fact Checkers

'PolitiFact' Is a group that declares themselves as the last word in telling you the truth about what politicians say.

They have been around since 2007 and have shown that republicans lie 80% of the time while democrats only 20%. PolitiFact is owned by the Tampa Bay Times which sides itself 90% of the time with democrats, no matter what is said.

Starting in the year 2009, they began an annual feature called the "Lie of the Year". If the "Lie of the Year" is about a republican, it goes on the Front Page of left leaning publications around the country. If against a democrat, it gets buried on page 6 or only found on their website.

In 2009 the "Lie of the Year" was given to Sarah Palin when she said that Obamacare would lead to "Death Panels that dictated which types of patients would receive treatment". During this time period PolitiFact had labeled 9 such statements as false but did not publicize it. No retraction needed.

In 2012 the "Lie of the Year" was Mitt Romney saying on the campaign trail for presidency that Obama "sold Chrysler to Italians who are going to build Jeeps in China". In truth Fiat bought a majority share of Chrysler after a government bailout. In January 2013, writer Mark Hemingway of *The Weekly* Standard criticized PolitiFact's ruling, writing that Romney's claim had turned out to be true. As the Jeep Patriot (Ironic Isn't It?) is now produced in China. No retraction has been made.

In 2013 the "Lie of the Year" was the statement by Obama saying; "If you like your health care plan, you can keep it". PolitiFact cited that in the first 30 days of Obamacare, over 4 million cancellation letters sent to American health insurance consumers. On November 7th, 2013 Obama publicly apologized that his healthcare plan was not intentionally meant to force people into the government health care system. However the plan stays in place, people are being forced to change plans in many cases costing more and providing less. While a retraction is not necessary, the law needs to be repealed or as Russian Prime Minister has said; "President Obama and his fellow Democrats are either idiots or deliberately trying to destroy their own economy."

Washington State Ex-Campaign Director Sentenced For Embezzlement

The former head of a Democratic Party fundraising committee in Washington state has been sentenced to over a year in prison for embezzling in excess of \$330,000 in campaign contributions to feed an alcohol-fueled gambling habit, prosecutors said.

Michael King, 32, pleaded guilty in October to four counts of first-degree theft and four counts of second-degree theft. He concealed the theft from the Senate Democratic Campaign Committee in part by reporting it as a series of phony reimbursements for political polling, according to court documents.

King County Superior Court Judge John Erlick sentenced King to just over one year in prison, to be followed upon his release by an equal term in community custody, the state's version of parole.

Delaying Security Deal Creates A Risk To Afghan Forces, U.S. Military Chief Says

The U.S. military could wait months for a political decision on whether troops stay or leave Afghanistan, but delaying a security pact would damage the confidence of Afghan forces and undermine NATO's plans, the top U.S. military officer said. The comments by U.S. Army Gen. Martin Dempsey, the chairman of the U.S. military's Joint Chiefs of Staff, came amid an impasse over the security pact, which would allow American troops to stay in Afghanistan beyond the end of 2014.

Obama's administration has said the pact needs to be signed this year, despite resistance from Afghan President Hamid Karzai, who has suggested the deal might not be concluded before presidential elections in April 2014.

U.N. Inspectors Visit Site Linked To Iran's **Nuclear Program**

U.N. inspectors visited an Iranian plant linked to a planned heavy-water reactor that could yield nuclear bomb fuel, taking up an initial offer by Tehran to open its disputed nuclear program to greater scrutiny.

The increased transparency is the result of a thaw in relations between Iran and the West that culminated in a deal struck last month under which Tehran is to curb its nuclear program in return for some easing of sanctions.

Iran's heavy water work is a big concern for the West because it could be used in the process of making a nuclear bomb. Tehran says its program is for peaceful

Clerk's Note: They inspected the plant knowing it has the capability of making a nuclear bomb and yet did not get it shut down or put limitations on its use. Iran is just stalling for time with this slow negotiation process which will allow it to continue in plain sight.

Controversial Helicopter Firms



After almost four years of allegations that two related helicopter companies in Lithuania and Russia were doing substandard work and should be banned from new contracts, the Pentagon continued to give them business, according to interviews and documents.

As recently as last month, an Army planning document shows, the service was weighing contracting helicopter overhauls from the firms, which have been the subject of multiple internal warnings and two Defense Department Inspector General reports.

A Pentagon spokeswoman said no work was under way on the project, which is under review.

The Pentagon has been working with Lithuanian company Aviabaltika and a sister Russian firm, the St. Petersburg Aircraft Repair Company (SPARC), for more than a decade to buy spare parts and overhaul Russian Mi-17 helicopters for Afghanistan

Set Your Goals High Enough To Inspire You And





Uruguay became the first country to legalize the growing, sale and smoking of marijuanasocial experiment that will be closely watched by other nations debating drug liberalization.

A government-sponsored bill approved by 16-13 votes in the Senate provides for regulation of the cultivation, distribution and consumption of marijuana and is aimed at wresting the business from criminals in the small South American nation.

Backers of the law, some smoking joints, gathered near Congress holding green balloons, Jamaican flags in homage to Bob Marley and a sign saying: "Cultivating freedom, Uruguay grows."

Cannabis consumers will be able to buy a maximum of 1.4 ounces each month from licensed pharmacies as long as they are Uruguayan residents over the age of 18 and registered on a government database that will monitor their monthly purchases. When the law is implemented in 120 days, Uruguayans will be able to grow six marijuana plants in their homes a year, or as much as 480 grams (about 17 ounces), and form smoking clubs of 15 to 45 members that can grow up to 99 plants per year.

If It Lasts More Than Four Hours...

A new study suggests that thousands of men seek care in U.S. emergency rooms each year for the painful condition known as priapism - an erection that lasts too long and threatens to permanently harm the penis. The researchers estimated that it costs \$124 million a year on average to treat priapism at hospitals. "We're not talking about a massive problem, but it's more common than we thought," said study author Dr. Daniel Stein, chief resident with the urology department at the Northwestern University's Feinberg School of Medicine. It's not clear how many of an estimated 10,000 cases annually are due to a side effect of Viagra and similar impotence drugs, but urologists say they've seen very few men suffering from the infamous fourhour-plus erections that TV ads warn about.

Sickle cell disease actually may be responsible for a much higher number of cases. Stein said the researchers launched their study because there's little information about the number of cases of priapism, which has gotten more attention in recent years because of the warnings related to impotence drugs. Priapism refers to an abnormal erection in which the blood that engorges the penis fails to drain out, Stein said. Blood stagnates in the penis, and tissue begins to die because it's not getting fresh oxygen. "The mood is gone, but the reaction is still there," he said. "It's remarkably painful. All men coming in with priapism are unhappy about it."

In the new study, researchers examined a database of U.S. emergency room visits from 2006 to 2009. Based on their statistics, they estimated that ER doctors treat an average of 10,000 cases of priapism each year; it's not clear how many are men who needed to be treated more than once. The average hospital cost to treat a patient was about \$1,800 for patients treated in the ER, and nearly \$42,000 for those who had to be hospitalized. Twenty-one percent of the patients also had sickle cell disease, in which red blood cells become deformed. The condition can cause the blood in the penis to thicken and not be able to drain, said Dr. Stephen Freedland, a urologist and associate professor of surgery and pathology at the Duke University School of Medicine. Although his clinic may see a case of priapism an average of once per week, Freedland said he can't easily recall treating a case caused by an erectile dysfunction drug like Viagra.

Study author Stein said the drugs can sometimes cause erections that last too long by boosting the blood flow into the penis. Another possible cause is an injection that some impotent men give them-selves to have an erection, Freedland said. Stein also said there's no apparent cause at all in some cases. The good news: Priapism can be treated. The bad news: The treatments are anything but comfortable. A blood sample is taken from the penis to confirm that a patient is suffering from priapism, Stein said. The next step is typically to put a needle into the penis and try to flush out the stagnant blood. If that doesn't work, physicians may try flushing out the blood again and perhaps move onto a procedure that cuts into the penis to release the blood, he said. Freedland said another treatment is to give the patient oxygen and fresh blood cells to get things moving. The study appeared in the October issue of The Journal of Sexual Medicine.

Japanese 'Super Submarine' From World **War II Finally Discovered**

Interesting Stuff



After more than half a century, a mystery of military history has finally been resolved. Researchers at the University of Hawaii and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) have discovered a missing World War II-era Japanese mega-submarine under more than 2,300 feet of water off the southwest coast of Oahu. The submarine, an I-400, has been missing since 1946.

It was the largest (400 feet) and most innovative of its day, capable of voyaging one and a half times around the world without refueling and deploying three bombers, each with a 1,800-pound bomb, within minutes of surfacing.

Up until it, submarines had simply been used to destroy ships. The I-400 presented a significant tactical change to have air strike capability from long-range submarines. "Following World War II," said Dr. James Delgado, director of NOAA's Maritime Heritage Program, "submarine experimentation and design changes would continue in this direction, eventually leading to ballistic launching capabilities for U.S. submarines at the advent of the nuclear era."

The I-400 submarine had actually been captured by the U.S. military at the end of World War II, but the U.S. had kept it and four other Japanese submarines at Pearl Harbor for inspection. In 1946, as the Cold War was just beginning, the Soviet Union demanded access to the missing submarines under terms of a World War II treaty. The U.S. Navy, not wanting the technology in Soviet hands, scuttled the submarines and then pleaded ignorance, claiming it didn't know where the warships had disappeared to. The location of the I-400 has been a mystery ever since. According to Terry Kerby, an undersea explorer who serves as operations director and chief submarine pilot at the university's Hawaii Undersea Research Laboratory, "The I-400 has been on our 'to-find' list for some time. It was the first of its kind of only three built, so it is a unique and very historic submarine.

Finding it where we did was totally unexpected," Kerby said in a press release. "All our research pointed to it being further out to sea." The crew found the site by carefully combing through side-scan sonar and multi-beam sonar data to identify anomalies on a deep sea floor littered with rocky outcrops and other debris. "It was a thrill when the view of a giant submarine appeared out of the darkness," Kerby said. The I-400 was actually discovered in August, 2013, but the announcement came early December after NOAA confirmed its findings with the U.S. State Department and Japanese government officials. The Hawaii Undersea Research Laboratory has now successfully located four of the five lost submarines.

U.S. Court Declares Detroit Bankrupt



A federal judge formally declared the city of Detroit, Mich., bankrupt, a landmark ruling that clears the way for potentially sweeping cuts to city worker pensions and retirement benefits and for steep and possibly precedent-setting losses to the cash-strapped city's bond holders.

The ruling by U.S. Judge Steven Rhodes, who cited the city's dismal finances and \$18 billion owed to a multitude of creditors in support of his decision, marks a watershed in the history of Detroit. Once known as the cradle of the U.S. auto industry, the arsenal of democracy and the birthplace of Motown music, Detroit now adds an ignominious new title: largest bankrupt city in U.S. history.

Judge Rhodes, in his ruling that Detroit is eligible, accepted the city's contention that it is broke and that negotiations with its thousands of creditors were infeasible. That was enough to declare Detroit bankrupt under Chapter 9 of the federal bankruptcy code, Rhodes ruled.

USS Shiloh Participates In Trilateral Naval Exercise With The United Kingdom And The Republic Of Korea



The Ticonderoga-class guided-missile cruiser USS Shiloh (CG 67), joined ships from the United Kingdom and the Republic of Korea Navy, Dec. 8-9, for a trilateral naval exercise in the waters to the south of the Korean Peninsula.

The naval exercise was aimed at improving teamwork and interoperability between the three navies in theater security cooperation and humanitarian relief operations.

The guided-missile destroyer ROKS Yulgok Yi I (DDG 992) and the Royal Navy destroyer HMS Daring joined USS Shiloh for the exercise.

"This was an exceptional opportunity to bring together three navies that have historically worked very closely together as allies and close friends," said Rear Adm. Lisa Franchetti, commander of U.S. Naval Forces-Korea. "This exercise provides our navies a chance to work together and learn from each other so we may continue to fulfill our common interests in preserving a safe and secure maritime environment."

USS Shiloh, with a crew of approximately 400 sailors, is part of the U.S. 7th Fleet and is assigned to Commander, Task Force 70. The ship is forward deployed to Yokosuka, Japan, to support security and stability operations and exercises throughout the Indo-Asia-Pacific region.





USS New York Changes Homeport To Naval Station Mayport



USS New York (LPD-21)

The Mayport, Fla., community welcomed over 350 new neighbors to Northeast Florida when USS New York (LPD 21) changed her homeport from Naval Station Norfolk, Va., to Naval Station Mayport, Fla. on Dec. 6.

USS New York is one of three ships that make up Iwo Jima Amphibious Ready Group (ARG) the Navy is moving from Norfolk to Mayport. The other two ships - USS Iwo Jima (LHD-7) and USS Fort McHenry (LSD-45) - are slated to arrive as early as 2014. The three ships will bulk up the Navy's fleet at Mayport, as the station's frigates are retiring. USS Underwood and USSKlakring decommissioned in March.

According to U.S. Rep. Alder Crenshaw, the move is a win-win situation for the Navy and the Mayport community. "As Congress deals with very difficult budget decisions, this is promising news for national security and the First Coast," Crenshaw said in a statement. "This first phase of the amphibious ready group move to Mayport underscores the Navy's commitment to a strategic dispersal of assets - a strategy I have long advocated on Capitol Hill."

USS New York is not the first Navy ship to hold that state's name, but never before has the name had so much meaning. The amphibious transport dock was built with 7-1/2 tons of steel from the World Trade Center. And USS New York is not the only ship that will be named to commemorate the Sept. 11 attacks, but it is the first. USS Somerset is under contract and the *USS Arlington* will follow.

James Officially Sworn In As Air Force Secretary



Deborah Lee James was sworn in as the 23rd secretary of the Air Force at a private ceremony in the Pentagon. James becomes the second woman to hold the position.

"I think our Air Force is in great shape given that we've been living through some difficult times,' James said in an Air Force news release. "I'm enormously optimistic about the future of our Air Force. We have nothing but opportunities to face in the upcoming years."

The U.S. Air Force will reduce the size of its civilian work force by about 900 positions in addition to maintaining approximately 7,000 vacancies across the force to meet the demands of a constrained fiscal 2014 budget, officials have announced. Specific reductions by location have not been determined. The Air Force will implement civilian work force shaping initiatives, along with continued targeted hiring to comply with mandatory funding targets and to rebalance the civilian work force to meet skill demands for fiscal 2014 and beyond. "The Defense Department used administrative furloughs to meet civilian pay budget demands in the compressed time frame between sequestration and the end of the FY13. We will meet a similar budgetary challenge in FY14 through a reduced work force," said Brig. Gen. Gina Grosso, the director of force management policy for the Air Force. The general added that the Air Force's strategy to meet civilian pay budget targets does not include a furlough. To reduce the number of employees assigned against previously and newly abolished positions, the Air Force plans to maximize the use of Voluntary Early Retirement Authority and Voluntary Separation Incentive Pay to entice employees who are eligible to leave federal service to do so voluntarily. These programs offer early retirement for employees who are considering life outside of federal service and up to \$25,000 for employees whose voluntary separation would save another employee from being involuntarily separated. "Over the last couple of years, the Air Force has gone through significant civilian pay budget challenges," Grosso said. "By implementing voluntary programs now we hope to mitigate future involuntary losses to the civilian work force." U.S.A.F leaders announced force management programs designed to reduce the force by thousands of airmen over the next five years as a result of sequestration. Air Force leaders made the decision to announce the overall strategic plan now so that airmen have the necessary time to consider all their career options. During testimony to the House Armed Services Committee in November, Gen. Mark A. Welsh, III, the Air Force chief of staff, said long-term impacts of sequestration could force the service to cut about 25,000 airmen over the next five years.

. "We know the Air Force is going to get smaller, but we don't know how much smaller, yet," Grosso said. "Force management programs will enable us to adjust the force size accordingly. 'Routine' voluntary programs have served us well, so far, but we expect to face much more stringent budget pressure and must now plan for and work toward a smaller force."

U.S. regulators announced new guidelines to phase out the use of antibiotics as a growth enhancer in livestock, in an effort to stem a surge in human resistance to these drugs.

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) said the antibiotics could still be used to treat illnesses in animals raised for meat, but should otherwise be pared back over the next three years under a program to keep them out of the human food supply.

It said two of the biggest purveyors of these antibiotics, Eli Lilly & Co., and Zoetis, Inc., had agreed to narrow their use. Doctors and hospitals have become increasingly worried by new strains of bacteria that cannot be controlled by a wide range of current antibiotics.

Former Army Officer Pleads Guilty



David Young - a former lieutenant colonel in the U.S. Army Reserve who in Hernando County, Fla., threw lavish political fundraisers, was known to neighbors as a war hero and bought more than a dozen homes - has pleaded guilty to a pair of federal charges and has agreed to serve between three and four years in

As part of the deal, he also agreed to forfeit the fortune and assets he acquired in his scheme to defraud the U.S. military: more than \$1.6 million cash, 15 properties on the North Suncoast, one in New Hampshire, a 1999 Jaguar and 400 1-ounce gold coins that at current prices would be valued at about \$500,000.

Young, 50, pleaded guilty to disclosure of procurement information and money-laundering and is scheduled for sentencing in March. His trial was set to begin in January, in Utah, where federal prosecutors have handled the case. If he had been convicted on both charges, Young could have faced up to 25 years in prison.

DOD's Reports To Congress To Be Posted Online

In a slight but welcome incremental reform, reports to Congress from the Department of Defense (DOD) are to be posted online, according to a provision in the pending FY-2014 defense authorization act.

Up to now, such reports were to be made available to the public "upon request" (10 USC 122a). But under section 181 of the FY 2014 defense authorization bill, as agreed to by House and Senate conferees, the reports would have to be posted on a "publicly accessible Internet website" whether they were requested or not.

The online publication requirement would not apply to DOD reports that contained classified or proprietary information, or that are otherwise exempt from disclosure under the FOIA.

Return For Asylum



Edward Snowden has written an "open letter to the people of Brazil" offering to assist Brazil's government investigate allegations of U.S. spying, but on the condition that he be granted permanent political asylum.

The letter was first published in Brazil's Folha newspaper. "I've expressed my willingness to assist where it's appropriate and legal, but, unfortunately, the U.S. Government has been working hard to limit my ability to do so," the letter says.

White House spokesman Jay Carney dismissed the suggestion that the United States could grant amnesty to former National Security Agency contractor Edward Snowden if he were to turn over the documents in his possession. "Mr. Snowden has been accused of leaking classified information and he faces felony charges here in the United States. He should be returned to the United States as soon as possible, where he will be accorded full due process in our system."

Feds Approve U.S. Navy's Sonar Training



The U.S. Navy's five year-plan to use sonar in training exercises off Southern California and Hawaii was approved by the National Oceanic and <u>Atmospheric Administration</u> (NOAA).

But several environmental groups, represented by San Francisco-based Earthjustice and anticipating the approval, immediately filed a lawsuit in a Hawaii federal court to block the training on grounds that the underwater noise poses an unacceptable threat to marine mammals.

NOAA, after a review by its fisheries division, concluded that the promised mitigation measures by the Navy will "minimize effects on marine mammals."

The Navy insists that the sonar training is crucial to prepare sailors to detect the super-quiet submarines owned or being developed by adversaries such as Iran, particularly in shallow waters like the Persian Gulf.

Environmentalists assert that the training could be conducted in places without large numbers of whales and other mammals and by avoiding the use of sonar sending out loud noises that subject the mammals to hearing loss, lung injuries and death.

NOAA, in its decision, noted that the Navy has promised to shut down use of sonar and explosives if marine mammals are spotted "within designated mitigation zones." The Navy has promised to designate a "humpback whale cautionary area" around Hawaii during winter months.

Also, NOAA's approval requires the Navy and federal fisheries' officials to meet annually to "discuss new science" and review whether additional mitigation measures are needed.

And Now For The Rest Of Your **Obamacare Taxes**

Here comes the ObamaCare tax bill. The cost of Obama's massive health care law will hit Americans in 2014 as new taxes pile up on their insurance premiums and on their income-tax bills.

Most insurers aren't advertising the Obamacare taxes that are added on to premiums, opting instead to discretely pass them on to customers while quietly lobbying lawmakers for a break. But one insurance company, Blue Cross Blue Shield of Alabama, laid bare the taxes on its bills with a separate line item for "Affordable Care Act Fees and Taxes."

The new taxes on one customer's bill added up to \$23.14 a month, or \$277.68 annually, according to Kaiser Health News. It boosted the monthly premium from \$322.26 to \$345.40 for that individual.

Then, there's the new Medicare tax. Under Obamacare, individual tax filers earning more than \$200,000 and families earning more than \$250,000 will pay an added 0.9 percent Medicare surtax on top of the existing 1.45 percent Medicare payroll tax. They'll also pay an extra 3.8 percent Medicare tax on unearned income, such as investment dividends, rental income and capital gains.

Good Government Guidelines

Chinese officials going on business overseas will no longer be able to charter planes or fly in private or corporate jets, guidelines announced today said, part of a broad government crackdown on corruption and waste. "Without exception, any excuse or method for exchanging gifts or souvenirs is not allowed," a statement on the Finance Ministry's website said. "It is strictly forbidden to accept, or covertly accept, subsidies from industry units, and strictly forbidden to shift or allot travel expenses to organizations abroad, subsidiary units or companies." Chinese newspapers frequently report on cases of government officials making spurious trips abroad on the public purse, ostensibly for work when in reality they are going on holiday or engaging in shopping sprees. Since taking over the reins of the Communist Party in November 2012 and the government in March, President Xi Jinping has vowed to crack down on corruption, which he has said threatens the party's survival.

Clerk's Note: Can we implement the same for our politicians? They get a gratuity whenever they appear in public, they call it a speaking fee, sometimes as much as \$50,000 to appear at an event or a fund raiser for another politician. Besides their taxpayer's salary of a quarter million a year, they can easily earn another million a year at speaking engagements. They also build up a private treasury they call a 'War Chest' which contains the funds they raise from you for reelection campaigns and other requests for money from the American public. The 'War Chest' is theirs to keep after they leave office.

New York Cop Fights Firing



A lawyer for a probationary town police officer in Clarkstown, N.Y., likely to be fired this week claims he is being let go because of his military service.

The town attorney called the allegation "absurd." The Town Board is expected to terminate Officer Steven Quinones tomorrow, effective Friday, based largely on recommendations by his department supervisors, officials said. Quinones' lawyer, Maureen McNamara, said her client, a U.S. Air Force veteran and a first lieutenant in the U.S. Army Reserve, is losing his job because he must take time away from work to fulfill the requirements of his military service. Accommodating his requests would create budgetary concerns for the town, she said.

Town officials described the issue as a "personnel matter," and refused to comment specifically about what has led to Quinones' current circumstances. But town Supervisor Alexander Gromack denied Quinones' situation has anything to do with military service or Clarkstown's budget. "The last four or five years, we've budgeted for 163 officers and we've stayed at that number, meeting that goal time and time again," Gromack said. He said veterans and reservists are encouraged to apply to the department, and that Quinones' pending termination is based "solely on his performance as a police officer."

In a letter to the Town Board and state officials, McNamara said her 31-year-old client was hired in February and, while attending the Rockland County Police Academy, informed a Clarkstown instructor that his military reserve unit could be deployed in 2014. McNamara said Quinones graduated from the academy and served ably in the police department, receiving satisfactory marks daily from his training officers. In April, the Town Board made him a permanent police officer. On Nov. 13, Quinones requested a Saturday off to meet his military reserve duties, McNamara said. Two days later, his most recent performance evaluation was retroactively revised, from "satisfactory" to "unsatisfactory," she said. Soon after, he was stripped of his police authority and told by supervisors to resign or prepare to be fired, she said.

U.S. Navy Releases Funds For V-22 **Procurement**



Funding for a second-year procurement of Bell-Boeing V-22 Osprey aircraft for the U.S. Marine Corps and the U.S. Air Force has been executed by the U.S. Navy. The funding amount is \$1.3 billion and covers three aircraft for the Air Force and 19 aircraft for the Marines.

"Since Initial Operating Capability in 2007, V-22s have been answering the nation's call traveling into harm's way," a Navy official said. "From combat operations in Iraq and Afghanistan to the recent disaster relief and humanitarian assistance in the Philippines, the V-22 continues to prove itself as a gamechanging aircraft. Ospreys enable our Marine Corps and Air Force Special Operations to execute missions not possible with conventional aircraft."

The V-22 is a multi-mission, tilt rotor aircraft with both a vertical take-off and landing and short take-off and landing capability. It has a maximum speed of 316 miles per hour at sea level and a range of 879 miles. A total of 233 V-22 Ospreys are in operation.

The second-year funding comes under a multi-year funding procurement contract for the purchase of a total of 100 V-22s over the next five years.

U.S. Government Assisting Child-Smuggling, Federal Judge Says

A federal judge in South Texas said in a recent order that the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) is assisting in criminal conspiracies to smuggle children into the country when it helps reunite them with parents who are known to be in the U.S. illegally.

U.S. District Judge Andrew Hanen, in Brownsville, made the comments in a 10-page order last Friday, at the conclusion of an immigrant smuggling case. Hanen expressed his frustration in having four cases in which a child who arrived in the U.S. illegally alone was reunited with a parent who was herself in the country illegally pass through his court in the past month. In the most recent case, Hanen sentenced a smuggler to 10 months in prison. But he saved his most withering words for the U.S. Government for not arresting and deporting the mother who hired the smuggler.

The order doesn't have the power to change policy, but it offers harsh criticism from a judge who regularly handles border issues but isn't known for being outspoken on immigration.

The case involved a woman who was arrested at an international bridge in Brownsville trying to use her daughter's birth certificate to smuggle in a 10year-old girl from El Salvador. The girl was then reunited with her mother who was living illegally in Virginia. "Instead of arresting (the child's mother) for instigating the conspiracy to violate our border security laws, the DHS delivered the child to herthus successfully completing the mission of the criminal conspiracy," Hanen wrote.

Veterans' groups fighting Pentagon's proposal to rein in benefits



The Pentagon's top civilian says it's time to tame burgeoning military personnel costs, but he's facing a test of wills with the nation's powerful veterans' groups, which want no cut in their benefits.

Veterans' groups are fighting curbs in annual pension increases for military retirees under age 62 that are part of the new budget deal passed by Congress last week and awaiting President Obama's signature. After a barrage of protests from the military community, lawmakers said they'll review the cut next year and possibly reverse it.

Defense Secretary Chuck Hagel said that the reform of military compensation can't be avoided. "We all know that we need to slow cost growth in military compensation," Hagel told a Pentagon press conference. "We know that many proposals will be controversial and unpopular. Tough decisions will have to be made."

OP/ED: A Serious Leader Would Have Abandoned Obamacare Long Ago

But not this guy. It's rather frightening when you think about it like this: Obamacare really amounts to the federal government trying to run, not just a business, but an entire industry. We're talking about the administration that appears to have the fewest members in history with private-sector business experience of any kind, and it thinks it can run the health insurance industry. How's that working out? Exactly.

To think some people laughed at me because my experience included running a pizza chain. And that was ironic: The first time Democrats tried this nonsense with Hillary Clinton designing their takeover of health insurance, it fell to me at a town hall meeting in Omaha to explain to Bill Clinton that the economics of small business don't work the way Democrats think they do, and that it wouldn't be feasible for employers to simply suck up the costs the way Mrs. Clinton was counting on to make the whole scheme work.

The Obama administration could use some folks with business experience, but as Donald Rumsfeld might say, you go to the socializing of medicine with the White House you've got. And that's a problem, because business people know something that this administration does not: When it's clear that your concept is fundamentally flawed, you don't waste time tinkering with it. You get rid of it and do something different.

The administration tinkered with Obamacare again on Thursday, now deciding that those who lost their insurance because of Obamacare and can't afford new insurance because of Obamacare will be exempted in 2014 from the individual mandate that is supposed to be essential to making Obamacare work. This is after they delayed the employer mandate because that can't work, and after they back-pedaled on forcing people out of the plans they had falsely promised they could keep, because that wasn't working - and of course after the launch of the web site that hasn't been working from day one. Just a little more tinkering and this whole thing will start working in grand fashion! Trust them! They're totally, entirely, completely, pretty sure, they think. Please!

Obamacare is imploding because it was designed by people who don't understand basic economics, enabled in no small part by health insurance companies that should have known better but were apparently starry-eyed over the idea that the federal government would mandate everyone buy their product. Now that the whole thing is coming apart at the seams and the White House is responding by tinkering with it on the fly, the insurers are upset because they actually do know how health insurance works, and they know these "fixes" don't fix anything. They know you can't mandate gold-plated coverage for everyone regardless of pre-existing conditions and not see premiums go up, and they know the risk pools won't work if those who are young and healthy don't sign up - which they're not.

Now they're reaping the consequences as the White House panics and takes steps designed to cover themselves politically instead of actually solving the problem.


And that gets to the heart of the matter. A bunch of left-wing ideologues trying to run an industry like health insurance is not going to work because these people have never run a business before. They only enterprise they've run is government, which bleeds red ink like it's going out of style, and they don't even understand there's anything wrong with that. Put them in charge of an industry where you actually have to satisfy customers - well, that's not going to end well

But more to the point, its been clear to everyone for months (and to some of us for four years, but never mind that now) that Obamacare is fundamentally flawed and cannot work, no matter how much you tweak it. The Obama presidency is now in a free fall because a combination of pride, arrogance and incompetence render the administration incapable of walking away from a fatally flawed concept. They will tweak. They will delay. They will hide facts. They will blame others. They will out-and-out lie about what's happening. But they won't do what they should do because they're not experienced enough at running things to know that they need to, and they're not humble enough to admit they made a mistake.

Even a pizza guy can see that.



The U.S. Embassy in Kabul was hit by indirect fire before dawn on Christmas Day, but no Americans were hurt, as attacks elsewhere in Afghanistan killed at least six people, officials said.

Two rounds struck the sprawling embassy compound but it was not immediately clear which part of the complex, and a U.S. Embassy official said the incident was under investigation. "At approximately 6:40, local time in Kabul, approximately two rounds of indirect fire impacted the U.S. Embassy compound," said the official, who spoke on condition of anonymity in line with regulations. "All Americans are accounted for and no injuries were sustained." (Indirect fire can refer to either mortars or rockets.)

The Taliban promptly claimed they fired four rockets at the American Embassy and said they inflicted heavy casualties. But the insurgents often exaggerate their claims.


